# 13D Galapagos Expedition Fly Cruise (Central Itinerary)

Every Thursday

Day	Gateway / Ports of Call	Arrive	Depart
Day 1/ THU	<b>SINGAPORE – QUITO</b> Assemble at Singapore Changi Airport for your flight to Quito. Upon arrival at Quito, transfer to your hotel.		
Day 2/ FRI	<b>QUITO (B)</b> Free at leisure		
Day 3/ SAT	<b>QUITO (B)</b> Today, we will fly from Quito to Baltra in the morning. Upon arrival, will transfer to ship.		
	<b>DAPHNE MAJOR</b> Devoid of larger trees, the rim of the volcano's cone rises to 120 meters. Cactus bushes, small trees and herbs provide food for several finch species –and a ground-breaking study in evolution over a forty year time span showed how food resource availability has led to evolutionary changes in finches. Apart from these small land birds, Red-billed Tropicbirds, Magnificent Frigatebirds and Nazca and Blue-footed Boobies also nest on Daphne Major and can often be seen soaring.		
Day 4/ SUN	<b>DARWIN BAY (GENOVESA)</b> At Genovesa Island the ship tucks into Darwin Bay, an ancient volcanic crater now flooded by the sea. Zodiacs land on a picturesque sandy beach where Galapagos sea lions often rest on the fine, white sand. Explorations along the shore may reveal marine iguanas looking like prehistoric dinosaurs in miniature.		
	<b>PRINCE PHILIP'S STEPS (GENOVESA)</b> Prince Philip's Steps, a small trail wanders past Red-footed Boobies, perching frigate birds, Nazca Boobies, Galapagos Mockingbirds, and Galapagos finches. The highlight however, is arriving on the windward side of the island to see hundreds of Wedge-Rumped Storm Petrels flying around in a frenzy of activity above the lava field where they nest.		
Day 5/ MON	<b>NORTH SEYMOUR</b> The landing at North Seymour Island is onto black lava rock. After a short climb, arrive at the island's flat plateau where a number of sea lions nurse pups and frigatebirds nest. The island is dry, and so the predominant tree is the prickly pear cactus favored by the yellow Conolophus land iguanas that live here in number.		
	<b>SANTIAGO (SILLIVAN BAY)</b> The lava fields of Sullivan Bay on Santiago Island will inevitably remind visitors of the surface of the moon. As brilliant red Sally Lightfoot crabs scuttle along the black volcanic shores, learn about the formation of the islands through geological forces from your guides.		
Day 6/ TUE	<b>RABIDA</b> Received accolades for being one of the most exotic spots is Rabida island. Common Cactus Finches feed on the yellow flowers while Darwin finches and lava lizards skitter across the path in search of food.		
	<b>SANTA CRUZ (EL EDEN)</b> Eden is a small, eroded tuff cone from an ancient volcano, and is an excellent example of the unique geology of the Galápagos. The shallow waters around the island are ideal for spotting Pacific green sea turtles, reef sharks, eagle rays, sea lions, marine iguanas and Sally Lightfoot crabs.		
Day 7/ WED	<b>SAN CRISTOBAL (GALAPAGUERA)</b> Giant tortoises are emblematic of the Galapagos Islands. The Silver Galapagos anchors off San Cristobal Island and Zodiacs take all ashore to the pretty little town of Puerto Baquerizo Moreno. From here we set out by bus for the Galapaguera Cerro Colorado Tortoise Reserve in the highlands of the island.		
	<b>PUNTA PIT ( SAN CRISTOBAL)</b> Walk along a path that runs through black basalt lava rocks or beachcomb at the landing beach looking for sea urchin skeletons and attractive blue-gray lichen grows on the rocks.		
Day 8/ THU	<b>GARDNER BAY</b> The blue water here is spectacular, allowing clear infinity and thanks to this water clarity snorkelers often spot reef sharks patrolling the reef wall, cruising Pacific green turtles, and playful Galapagos sea lions.		
	<b>PUNTA SUAREZ (ESPANOLA ISLAND)</b> Punta Suárez lies at the western point of Española, the oldest island in the Galápagos. Sheer cliffs provide superb thermals for seabirds and you may spot Swallow-tailed Gulls, Nazca Boobies and Blue-footed Boobies on the breeze. The largest seabird to nest in the Galapagos Islands is the Waved Albatross.		
Day 9/ FRI	<b>FAUSTO LLERENA BREEDING CENTER, PUERTO AYORA (SANTA CRUZ)</b> Charles Darwin Research Station which houses the Fausto Llerena Breeding Center for giant tortoises and land iguanas guides will interpret the center's captive breeding and reintroduction programs and thereafter enjoy free time in town.		
	<b>SOUTH PLAZA</b> South Plaza is one of the smallest of the Galapagos Islands. Formed by geological uplift and tilted downward on the northern side, the southern cliffs have a height of up to 23 meters. At the landing site on the northern side sea lions are often seen, but it is the flora and land iguanas that are special. Land iguanas are often seen next to the prickly pear cacti, as the plant gives shade and the pads are eaten by the iguanas.		
Day 10 SAT	<b>SAN CRISTOBAL</b> Disembark and fly from San Cristobal to Guayaquil, transfer from airport to hotel.		
Day 11/ SUN	<b>GUAYAQUIL – SINGAPORE</b> Free at leisure and transfer to the airport for your flight home.		
Day 12/ MON	<b>CROSS INTERNATIONAL DATELINE</b>		
Day 13/ TUE	Arrival Singapore		

# 13D Galapagos Expedition Fly Cruise (Western Itinerary)

Every Thursday

Day	Gateway / Ports of Call	Arrive	Depart
Day 1/ THU	<b>SINGAPORE – QUITO</b> Assemble at Singapore Changi Airport for your flight to Quito. Upon arrival at Quito, transfer to your hotel.		
Day 2/ FRI	<b>QUITO (B)</b> Free at leisure		
Day 3/ SAT	<b>QUITO (B)</b> Today, we will fly from Quito to San Cristobal in the morning. Upon arrival, will transfer to ship.		
	<b>KICKER ROCK</b> Kicker Rock is the vertical remnant of a former tuff cone less than 5 kilometers to the west of San Cristobal. Both its Spanish name “Leon Dormido” (Sleeping Lion) and English name Kicker Rock imply that it is one rock only. Blue-footed Boobies, Nazca Boobies and frigatebirds can be observed in the air, while sea lions can be seen along the shore.		
Day 4/ SUN	<b>ISLA BARTOLOME</b> Pass through the arid volcanic landscape, chance to watch for lava lizards, Galapagos Hawks, and Blue-footed Boobies.		
	<b>PLAYA ESPUMILLA (SANTIAGO)</b> Playa Espumilla is home to a variety of wildlife including nesting green sea turtles, and plentiful birds such as flamingos, White-cheeked Pintails, Yellow Warblers, Galapagos Hawks, Whimbrels, and American Oystercatchers. Zodiacs will land you at the center of the white-sand beach to join a trail that passes by a seasonal lagoon hosting a variety of bird life.		
Day 5/ MON	<b>PUNTA VICENTE (ROCA ISABELA)</b> The cliffs support endemic Flightless Cormorants, Galapagos fur seals, Blue-footed Boobies, and marine iguanas. The waters below hold scores of Eastern Pacific green sea turtles swimming all around the Zodiacs. If conditions allow, fortunate snorkelers will have an opportunity to swim with eagle rays, Galapagos sea lions, Galapagos Penguins, and schools of small tuna in the blue.		
	<b>PUNTA ESPINOZA (FERNANDINA)</b> Hundreds of marine iguanas rest on the black rock of recent lava flows absorbing heat from the stone and defending their territories against one another. Galapagos sea lions and their pups also take shelter here, resting on the beach and playing in the shallow tide pools sprinkled along the coast.		
Day 6/ TUE	<b>TAGUS COVE</b> The cove named after the British frigate HMS Tagus visiting the Galapagos in 1814. On approach Galapagos Penguins and Flightless Cormorants –both birds mainly found on Isabela’s west coast and neighboring Fernandina- are often seen. During the hike several land birds including Medium Ground-Finches, Galapagos Hawks, Yellow Warblers as well as Large-billed and Vermilion Flycatchers are often present.		
	<b>ELIZABETH BAY</b> Las Marielas, three rocks at the entrance to the bay, are favored by Blue-footed Boobies, Flightless Cormorants and Galapagos Penguins as a resting place, while the mangrove area is preferred by Great Blue Herons for hunting or the Magnificent Frigatebirds for perching. The bay is used by turtles, rays and even sharks for feeding or resting.		
Day 7/ WED	<b>POST OFFICE BAY (FLOREANA)</b> The bay is steeped in history and received its name thanks to a post box that was placed ashore before 1813 and offers kayaking, snorkeling, swimming and relaxing on the beach. Rays, blacktip reef sharks, Galapagos sea lions, herons, frigatebirds, Brown Pelicans, Darwin finches, and Yellow Warblers can all be spotted here.		
	<b>CHAMPION ISLET (FLOREANA)</b> Curious sea lions approach the snorkelers while turtles slowly swim by and sharks, sting rays, and a high diversity of colorful fishes can usually be seen.		
	<b>PUNTA CORMORANT (FLOREANA)</b> From the landing beach a short track leads to a shallow lagoon that is famous for its flamingos. The trail then scales a low hillside through scattered Palo Santo trees to reveal an idyllic white-sand beach on the other side of the point.		
Day 8/ THU	<b>CERRO DRAGON (SANTA CRUZ)</b> Cerro Dragón’s land iguanas once played an important part in a conservation program headed by the Charles Darwin Foundation and the Galapagos National Park. Program success can see today, walking on trail.		
	<b>SANTA CRUZ (LAS BACHAS)</b> A short track leads visitors inland towards a shallow pond with the opportunity to spot flamingos, migratory birds in season, and scavenging shorebirds. There will be the chance to swim from one of the two sandy beaches and to look for sea turtles that use Las Bachas as one of their major nesting sites in the islands.		
Day 9/ FRI	<b>SANTA CRUZ (LOS GEMELOS)</b> Walk along the craters’ edges before stopping at Rancho El Manzanillo to see giant Santa Cruz tortoises in the wild. On the ranch swap walking shoes for knee-high rubber boots and wade out in to the green fields to come close to majestic giant tortoises and search for the coveted Woodpecker Finch.		
	<b>FAUSTO LLERENA BREEDING CENTER, PUERTO AYORA (SANTA CRUZ)</b> Charles Darwin Research Station which houses the Fausto Llerena Breeding Center for giant tortoises and land iguanas guides will interpret the center’s captive breeding and reintroduction programs and thereafter enjoy free time in town.		
Day 10 SAT	<b>BALTRA</b> Disembark and fly from Baltra to Guayaquil, transfer from airport to hotel.		
Day 11/ SUN	<b>GUAYAQUIL – SINGAPORE</b> Free at leisure and transfer to the airport for your flight home.		
Day 12/ MON	<b>CROSS INTERNATIONAL DATELINE</b>		
Day 13/ TUE	Arrival Singapore
